A Love for Public Celebration ~ A Quiet Passion for Helping Others



Ask those who knew **Dee and Albert Hoeme** what they remember about them, the answer will almost always be the same: "They loved to entertain." And entertain, they did. Over the course of their 34 years of marriage, Dee and Albert were founding and active members of the Club 100 Dances and annual hosts of the legendary HRC Christmas party. In case you think that you never had a chance to participate in any of the festivities they founded, think again. Anyone who has attended the annual Beefiesta held during the Scott County Fair or rubbed shoulders with KSU athletes and coaches at the K-State Fry has benefited from Dee and Albert's love of entertaining. Some of the events were elaborate and large like the HRC Christmas parties which were regularly attended by over 500 friends, employees and fellow cattlemen.

"A Dee and Albert event," especially the Club 100 dances, often called for some "serious dressing up." However, many of the parties were smaller and hosted from their family home including endless games of bridge. But the common theme of all who reminisce about Dee and Albert: They made all their guests feel welcome.

Both graduates of SCHS, Norma Dee (Hughes) and Albert Hoeme eloped to Albuquerque to get married in 1955. They were both members of local farm families with deep roots in Scott Community. In 1969 they made their mark in the cattle industry by establishing with two other partners the HRC Feed Yards. Albert was also a founding member of the Scott City Investors Club which was active for over 30 years. Dee and Albert loved and believed in this community where they raised their three children and were later active grandparents to 10 grandchildren and honorary grandparents to many others. In her later years, Grammy Dee rarely missed a local sporting activity where she could watch the young ones participate.

While Dee and Albert's most public persona was one of entertainers, there was a lesser known back story to their lives, unknown even to family members. After Albert's death in 1989, people would come up to their children to tell them stories of how Albert had reached out to help them on an individual basis. From loaning cars to small loans or gifts, with little fanfare or fuss, Albert and Dee kept track of the people that came into their lives and did what they could to give a helping hand.



To remember their parents and create a legacy that reflected their lives, the children of Dee and Albert decided after Dee's death in 2009 to honor them by establishing the **Albert and Dee Hoeme Scholarship Fund** under the Scott Community Foundation. This fund provides scholarships to SCHS graduates. In 2011, the Hoeme family also founded the **Albert and Norma Dee Memorial Fund** and the **Hoeme Family Fund** to support community projects and Scott County non-profit organizations. Over the past 8 years, donations from these funds have been distributed annually, including grants for EMS Training, Protective Equipment for SCHS Ag Classes, and E books for the Scott County schools and Scott County Library. The establishment of these funds is a fitting legacy that continues to reflect the generous spirits of Dee and Albert Hoeme and keeps alive their love for their family and community.
